STAGE NEWS

Early Stage 1

Welcome back to Term 2! This term we are developing our reading skills by thinking about the story, recognising sight words and blending phonemes in words. We will become more independent in Writing by brainstorming adjectives and editing our work. In Mathematics, we will learn about place value, odd and even numbers, and adding complete tens. Our Science unit this term focuses on how objects move and the forces that impact on movement, such as, gravity and friction. In History, we will be learning about the Aboriginal dreamtime. Our fundamental movement skills for Term 2 are 'jump' and 'catch'. We will also be participating in aerobic dance lessons, and our school "Peer Support" program which teaches children about interpersonal relationships. We will continue to expand our fine-motor skills in a variety of fantasy inspired artworks, and will explore body percussion in Music. Our acting skills will be harnessed in an engaging Drama unit on "Toys". We are looking forward to another productive and exciting term!
